1. Progress Report re Flashflood Incident in San Jose, Tarlac (Region III)

A. Situation Overview

On or about 3:30 PM, 30 August 2015, fifty-four (54) mountaineers from University of the Philippines Manila and Tarlac Gamenest MC went to Sitio Baag, Barangay Iba, San Jose, Tarlac for an outreach activity.

After the activity, the group went back to the drop-off area and as they cross the Pangasinan Creek at Sitio San Pedro, Barangay Iba, San Jose, Tarlac, fast moving water coming from the mountain ranges swept the group away.

B. Effects

a. A total of six (6) individuals were reported dead and nine (9) were injured due to the flashflood:

C. Actions Taken

- OCD III coordinated with San Jose, Tarlac DRRM Officer and with the Municipality of San Jose Vice Mayor for information about the incident and augmentation of PNP San Jose, 3rd Mechanized Infantry Battalion, Philippine Army (PA), and Tarlac Police Provincial Office (TPPO) for the conduct of Search and Rescue (SAR) Operation.
- 2. PDRRMO Tarlac dispatched one (1) Disaster Action Response Team (DART) to the area in coordination with Sustainable Tourism Department Project (STDP).
- PDRRMO Taclac provided transportation assistance to survivors and provided rescue equipment to responding rescue teams.
- 4. PDRRMO Tarlac coordinated with Tarlac Police Provincial Office and San Jose Municipal Station, 3rd MIB, Tarlac Operations Group 3, UP and Tarlac Mountaineering Club, Tarlac EMS, San Jose LGU/MDRRMC Rescue and local guides for the deployment of their assets and personnel in the conduct of Joint Search, Rescue and Retrieval Operation

B. Actions Taken:

- NDRRMC Advisory on the earthquake information was disseminated to OCD Regional Center XI through facsimile, SMS and website for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- DOST-PHIVOLCS is closely monitoring the situation and any new significant development will be immediately relayed to all concerned.
- OCD-RDRRMC XI is closely monitoring the incident

3. Lightning Incident in Coron, Palawan (Region IV-B)

A. Situation Overview:

 On or about 11:00 AM, 20 August 2015, a lightning incident transpired at Sitio Pinagbalatan, Brgy. Decalachao, Coron, Palawan. A farmer identified as Tanail C. Batoto, 25 years old died due to burns.

C. Actions Taken:

- OCD MIMAROPA coordinated with MDRRMO Coron, Palawan re the incident
- Municipal Police Station Coron conducted investigation of the incident

4. Heavy Rains with Strong Winds in Municipalities of Banga, Norala and Koronadal City, South Cotabato (Region XII)

A. Situation Overview:

- On 27 August 2015, a heavy rainfall with strong wind brought about by local thunderstorm was experienced in Koronadal City and Municipalities of Banga, and Norala resulting to damage to properties, agricultural crops, and uprooted trees.
- A total of 100 families / 438 persons were affected in the said municipalities, families were staying with their relatives
- A total of 83 houses were damaged (Partially-72 houses; Totally-11 houses)
- Cost of damages is estimated at ₱340.000.00

B. Actions Taken:

- MDRRMCs of Norala and Banga, and CDRRMC Koronadal City conducted ocular inspection and damage assessment, and distributed family food packs
- Norala LGU-MEO conducted clearing operations in roads with fallen trees and other debris
- OCD XII continuously monitoring the incident

5. Progress Report re Internal Displacement at Pantar, Lanao del Norte due to Family Feud (Rido) (Region X)

A. Situation Overview

- An internal displacement due to Family Feud (Rido) is reported to have occurred around 1:20 PM, 26 August 2015 in Poblacion, Pantar, Lanao del Norte.
- A total of 1,411 families/7,759 persons were affected and evacuated to Pantar National High School and Bgy. Poblacion Covered Court:

B. Actions Taken

 LGU Pantar assisted in the evacuation with Pantar MSWDO providing food packs to the displaced families.

- Elements of the 4th Mechanized Infantry Battalion of the Philippine Army and PNP-Provincial Headquarters (PHQ) Lanao del Norte were deployed to ensure that no further skirmishes occur.
- Per Sangguniang Bayan Resolution No. 028-2015 dated August 25, 2015, the local government of Pantar declared the above-mentioned barangays under a state of calamity

6. Initial Report re Fire Incident at Zone 1, Luyong Bonbon, Opol, Misamis Oriental (Region X)

A. Situation Overview:

- A fire incident transpired at Zone 1, Luyong Bonbon, Opol, Misamis Oriental at 6:45 PM, 01 September 2015
- No casualties reported
- The exact number of families affected and damaged houses are still being determined
- Cost of damages is estimated at ₱800,000.00

B. Actions Taken:

 BFP Opol, Misamis Oriental immediately responded to the said incident and is still investigating the cause of fire
