### **1. Initial Report re: Oil Spill in Morong, Rizal**

#### **A. Situation Overview:**

- At 5:00 PM, 08 September 2015, an oil spill occurred at the Antipolo-Teresa-Morong Rivers.
- The Philippine Coast Guard-NCR estimated that 2,000 liters of bunker oil spilled from CEMEX and flowed through the said rivers.
- No report was received on the affected populace.

#### **B. Actions Taken:**

- The PCG directed CEMEX to bring and set up an oil boom in Morong to recover/contain the oil spill. PCG will supervise the clean-up operations.
- The PDRRMO and LDRRMOs of affected municipalities are monitoring the incident in coordination with the PCG-NCR.

### **2. Flooded areas due to thunderstorms in Metro Manila**

#### **A. Situation Overview:**

- At about 6:30 PM, 08 September 2015, a thunderstorm occurred which resulted to flooding in Metro Manila
