1. Flashflood and Landslide Incident in Pagadian City (REGION IX)

A. Situation Overview:

1. At 4:00 PM, 21 September 2015, a flashflood in Brgy. Tiguma, and a landslide incident in Brgy. Balintawak, all in Pagadian City, occurred due to strong and heavy rains brought about by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Visayas and Mindanao.

B. Effects:

FLASHFLOOD

1. A total of 333 families/ 1,665 persons were affected and 333 houses were damaged (Totally-2, Partially-331) in eight (8) zones in the said barangay due to the flashflood

LANDSLIDE

2. One (1) individual identified as James Clyde Delparine, a resident of Brgy. Lacupayan, Tigbao, Zamboanga del Sur was reported dead on arrival when rushed to the Jamilarin Hospital in the same City due to landslide

C. Actions Taken:

1. Pagadian City DRRMO, City Press Bureau, City DILG, City Traffic Management and PNP Traffic assess the affected area.
2. BLGUs and Pagadian City DRRMO immediately provided assistance to the victims
3. OCDRC IX is closely coordinating with Pagadian City DRRMO for the assistance needed of and continuously monitoring the whole region for any related incident

2. Floodings in Metro Manila (NCR)

A. Situation Overview:

1. At 9:40 PM, 22 September 2015, some areas in Caloocan City, CAMANAVA and Quezon City were reported flooded due to thunderstorms in the area

B. Effects:

1. Areas in Valenzuela City (Brgy. Maysan) and Mandaluyong (Plainview and Old Zaniga) were reported flooded and are not passable to light vehicles.
2. Flooding in the said areas already subsided as of 9:00 AM, 23 September 2015.

C. Actions Taken:

1. OCD-NCR is closely monitoring the situation.
