I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TYPHOON "JENNY" has slightly intensified as it moves in a Northwest direction.

Location of Center: (as of 10:00 p.m.)	955 km East of Basco, Batanes
Coordinates:	20.0°N, 131.1°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 130 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 160 kph.
Movement:	Forecast to move Northwest at 11 kph.
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	24 hour (Tomorrow evening): 770 km East of Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes 48 hour (Sunday evening): 560 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes. 72 hour (Monday evening): 595 km North Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes, outside the PAR. 96 hour (Tuesday evening): (outside PAR) 750 km North Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes. 120 hour (Wednesday evening): (outside PAR) 1060 km Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 600 km diameter of the Typhoon.
- Fisher folks are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Southern Luzon, of Visayas and of Mindanao.
- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next update which will be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast to be issued at 5 AM today and for the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at 11 AM today.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 06 re Typhoon "JENNY"** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
