I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"LANDO" has intensified into Typhoon and is now threatening the Aurora-Isabela

area.			
Location of Center: (as of 4:00 a.m.)	670 km East of Baler, Aurora		
Coordinates:	15.5°N, 127.8°E		
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph.		
Movement:	Forecast to move West at 15 kph.		
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	Tomorrow morning: 315 km East of Baler, Aurora Sunday morning: 60 km North Northeast of Casiguran, Aurora Monday morning in the vicinity of Lacub, Abra Tuesday morning 135 km Northwest of Calayan, Cagayan Wednesday morning 170 km Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes

- Estimated rainfall amount is from heavy to intense within the 550 km diameter of the Typhoon.
- Fisher folk are advised NOT to venture out over the northern and western seaboards of Northern Luzon, western seaboard of Central Luzon and eastern seaboard of Visayas.
- Light to moderate rains with occasional gusty winds over areas under PSWS #1.
- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 05 re Typhoon "LANDO" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
