Typhoon "LANDO" continues to move slowly towards the Regions of Cordillera and Ilocos.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from heavy to intense within the 600 km diameter of the typhoon.
- Fisherfolk are advised NOT to venture out over seaboards of Luzon and Visayas.
- Occasional rains and gusty winds will be experienced over provinces under PSWS#1
 while those under PSWS#2 and #3 will have stormy weather. Residents in low lying and
 mountainous areas of the provinces with PSWS are alerted against possible flashfloods
 and landslides.
- Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) elsewhere is now lowered.
- The public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next bulletin to be issued at 11:00 PM today.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 15 re Typhoon "LANDO" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their Areas of Responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
