1. Report re: Fire Incident in Brgy. 172 Zone 17 I. Santos St., Malibay, Pasay City (NCR)

A. Situation Overview:

- On or about 1838H, 30 October 2015, a fire incident involving residential houses occurred in Brgy. 172 Zone 17 I. Santos St., Malibay, Pasay City.
- At around 1855H of the same day, the fire reached 4th alarm but was declared fire out at 2224H, of the same day.
- Cause of fire is still under investigation.

B. Effects:

- Around 15 houses and approximately 30 families are affected.
- A certain Mr Roel Aquino, who sustained 1st degree burns on both shoulders and 2nd degree burns on both hands, is currently being treated at the Pasay City General Hospital.
- Estimated total cost of damages is at PhP1.2M.

C. Actions Taken:

- Bureau of Fire (BFP) and other fire brigade volunteers responded to the incident.
- OCD NCR coordinated with Pasay BFP for information and report.

2. Report re: Fire Incident at Brgy. Sinikway, Lapuz, Lapaz, Iloilo City (Region VI)

D. Situation Overview:

- Around 1545H, 30 October 2015, a fire incident occurred in a residential area in Blk 1, Brgy. Sinikway, Lapuz, Lapaz, Iloilo City.

- The fire allegedly started in a two-storey residential house owned by Reynaldo Loraiez and spread out to two more houses.
- At 1622H of the same day, fire out was declared by the Bureau of Fire (BFP).
- Cause of fire is still under investigation.

E. Effects:

- Reynaldo Loraiez suffered from 1st degree burns in his right forearm.
- Cost of damages is estimated to be around PhP100,000.00.

F. Actions Taken:

- BFP and Iolilo Citizen's Action Group (ICAG) responded to the incident.
 - Iloilo City Emergency Responders (ICER) and Red Cross ambulances provided emergency assistance.
