I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"MARILYN" has maintained its strength as it moves in a west northwest direction.

Location of Center: (as of 10:00 PM)	1,040 km east northeast of Virac, Catanduanes
Coordinates:	14.7°N, 133.8°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 175 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 210 kph.
Movement:	Forecasted to move West at 25 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	Tomorrow evening: 975 km east of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan Tuesday evening: 1,010 km east of Aparri, Cagayan Wednesday evening: 1,145 km east of Basco, Batanes Thursday evening: 1,590 km east northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (Outside PAR) Friday evening: 2,080 km northeast of Itbayat, Batanes
	NO PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 550 km diameter of the typhoon.
- Fisher folk are advised NOT to venture out over seaboards of Northern Luzon and over the eastern seaboards of Luzon and Visayas.
- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 02 re Typhoon "MARILYN" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants

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You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) are subsequently advised to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
