I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

An armed encounter between government troops and the Moro National Liberation Front (MNLF) occurred on 9 September 2013 at around 1:45 AM at Sitio Bugok, Barangay Sta. Catalina, Zamboanga City. The said skirmish later spread to nearby barangays of the city namely: **Sta. Barbara, Rio-Hondo, and Mariki**. The MNLF Group held a number of civilians in Barangays Sta. Catalina, Talon-Talon, and Kasanyangan and used them as hostages/human shields. Zamboanga City Mayor Isabelle "Beng" Climaco-Salazar implemented curfew from 8:00 PM to 5:00 AM throughout the city that day.

The following day, series of fire incidents broke out in various affected barangays and fire fighters of the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) were not able to respond immediately due to the incessant exchange of gunfires between the groups.



To ensure that basic government services in the city is not disrupted, the Office of the President issued Memorandum Circular No. 54 on 12 September 2013 directing all department secretaries and heads of agencies, bureaus, and offices in the city and adjoining provinces to provide the needed services to the public. On 13 September 2013, Zamboanga City government issued Ordinance No. 418 for the conduct of the forced evacuation of all families in Barangays Sta. Catalina, Sta. Barbara, Rio-Hondo, Mampang, Talon-Talon, and Mariki.



After temporary suspension of operations, Zamboanga International Airport resumed operations on 15 September 2013 to allow government/military flights to transport assistance/relief goods and personnel. On 16 September 2013, the whole city was put under Level 4 Crisis Management with Pres. Benigno Aquino III managing the situation. On the ninth day of the crisis, 17 September 2013, Police SSUPT Jose Chiquito Malayo, Chief of PNP Zamboanga City, was abducted by the rebel but was released at around 5:45 PM later that day.

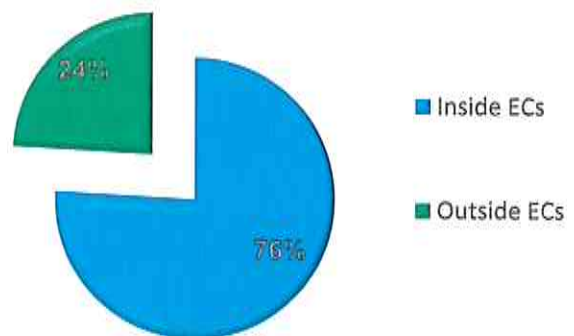
At around 6:00 AM, 21 September 2013, a fire incident occurred at Ayer Village, Brgy, Sta. Barbara. An hour later, a mortar bomb exploded at Atilano Compound, Don Alfaro, Tetuan, Zamboanga City which killed Norma Llodores Gonzales, 71 years old. Sporadic skirmishes lessened each day, then finally, on 28 September 2013, Secretary Voltaire T. Gazmin, Department of National Defense, declared that the 20-day crisis has finally ended. Even after the declaration, government troops continued conducting house to house clearing operations. In total, 195 hostages were rescued by the government forces.



II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population¹

As of 06 February 2013, **23,794 families / 118,819 persons** have been affected and were evacuated because of the armed conflict. Of this number, **18,056 families / 80,757 persons** took shelter in **60** evacuation centers, while **5,738 families / 38,062 persons** stayed with their relatives/friends.

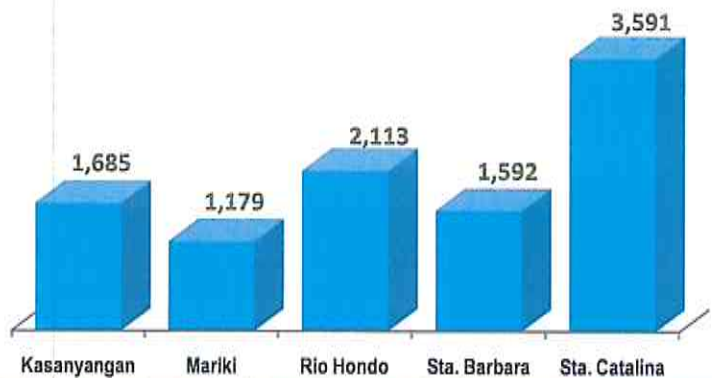
B. Casualties (Validated with the AFP)

C. Damaged Houses

The series of fire incidents damaged a total of 10,160 houses in various barangays with Barangay Sta. Catalina having the largest number of houses destroyed:



D. Result of the Post Conflict Needs Assessment (PCNA)

On 14 - 31 October 2013, a PCNA team composed of personnel from OCDRO IX, OCDRO X, OCD-ARMM, OCD CO, RDRRMC IX, and the City Government of Zamboanga was deployed to the city to validate the damages and losses incurred from the conflict, and eventually assess the amount needed for the recovery and reconstruction of the damaged infrastructure, agriculture, and other vital properties.

The total damages is estimated **₱3,264,410,494.07**, and the total losses is at **₱2,898,837,465.94**. A total of **₱2,527,912,934.39** is needed in aid for reconstruction and recovery.

E. Status of Lifelines

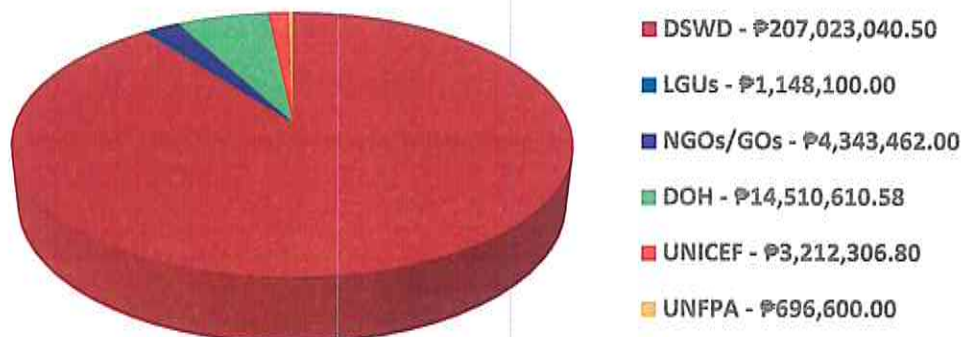
Due to the escalating violence, all commercial flights and sea travels going in and out of the city were cancelled on 09 September 2013. On 18 September 2013, Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) facilitated special commercial roundtrip flights of Cebu Pacific Air and PAL Express to cater passengers travelling from Manila to the city and vice versa. After days of suspended/limited operations, trips of rural transit buses in the city resumed on 16 September 2013, while other local public transportations limited their trips outside the affected barangays.

Power interruption was experienced in some affected barangays due to the conflict.

III. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

A. Cost of Assistance²

A total of **₱230,934,119.88** worth of medicines, medical supplies and relief goods have been extended to the affected families, and financial assistance to casualties and rescued hostages:



- DSWD Released ₱51.5 Million additional standby funds for purchase of relief goods as of 23 September 2013
- DSWD formulated ₱3.89 Billion worth of early recovery and rehabilitation plan for the victims:
 - Relief assistance for 23,794 families at ₱250.00/pack per family for 30 days or a month amounting to ₱178.46 Million
 - Balik-Probinsya Program for 2,125 families at an average of ₱5,000.00/family amounting to ₱10.63 Million
 - Educational assistance for 21,387 children at ₱5,000.00 each amounting to ₱106.94 million
 - Supplementary feeding program for 15,446 kids aged 2-5 years old at ₱13.00/child/day for 120 feeding days amounting to ₱24.10 Million
 - Cash-for-work/training (CFW/T) for 23,794 families at ₱210.00/person/day for 30 days amounting to ₱149.90 Million
 - Construction of 2,126 bunkhouses for 21,252 families at ₱375,000.00/unit (10 rooms) amounting to ₱797.25 Million
 - Shelter assistance for 21,252 families at ₱100,000.00 each amounting to ₱2.13 Billion
 - Livelihood assistance for 21,252 families at ₱10,000.00 each amounting to ₱212.52 Million
 - Operational and/or administrative expenses for the project management amounting to ₱285.02 Million

- On 14 September 2013, attended a meeting with PRC, ICRC, and DSWD IX re the augmentation of relief goods to the evacuees
- At around 7:30 AM, 18 September 2013, OCD IX convened with UN-OCHA for the final instructions regarding the conduct of Rapid Needs Assessment to 10 evacuation areas
- At 11:00 AM, 18 September 2013, OCD IX convened with Zamboanga City Health Office at Emergency Hospital, WMSU regarding the management of dead and missing persons
- At 9:00 AM, 19 September 2013, convened with Col. Natalio A. Jayson, PA, Chief, Civil Affairs Division regarding the transportation of relief goods
- On 23 September 2013, 2:00 PM, a meeting presided by DSWD Sec. Dinky Soliman was held at the Sangguniang Panlungsod, R.T. Lim Boulevard, Zamboanga City regarding the organization of different clusters using the cluster approach for the early recovery and rehabilitation of the affected populace

DSWD-FO IX

- Contacted by Monde Nissin regarding the delivery of goods in Zamboanga City
- Bureau of Trade Regulation and Consumer Protection (BTRCP) coordinated with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) regarding food supply and evacuation centers
- Provided big cooking pots to clustered groups for cooking of meals and food packs to the Badjao Community evacuees
- Set-up three (3) community kitchens

PRC

- Facilitated the shipment of food, NFI, and medicines on 11 September 2013 via PAF C-130 plane to Zamboanga City
- Negotiated with the MNLF Commander to allow Red Cross to bring food to the abandoned children in Talon-Talon and talked to the hostages before they were transported to the Western Mindanao Command (WESMINCOM), Camp Navarro General Hospital (CNGH), for briefing and further medical attention

- Continuously conducted cleaning operations in the evacuation centers to maintain good health and sanitation

- Distributed 600 protection kits and 600 hygiene kits including plastic rolls for 727 vulnerable families in Zamboanga City and Basilan; on-going distribution of additional relief items
- Provided Vitamin A supplementation, deworming and measles vaccination for children in all evacuation camps
- Distributed 1,300 hygiene kits, 1,000 water kits (jerry cans and hyposol), and 350 WASH posters; provided 30 portalets

USAID and Private Sector

- Installed 34 portalets in the evacuation centers

DSWD

- Deployed Social Workers to provide the immediate needs of the four (4) rescued minors and one (1) adult, and for the issuance of affidavits against their hostage takers
- Secured and transferred children from the FO's Reception and Study Center for Children (RSCC) to the Mercedes Formation Center in coordination with Religious Organizations
- Conducts sessions of play and art therapy to children in Day Care Centers in Joaquin Enriquez Memorial Sports Complex, Cawa-cawa
- Established Stress Debriefing/Trauma Management Center, Center for Elderly, Center for PWDs, SNP and Day Care Centers for Children, Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD), Psychosocial Processing (PSP) Centers, Supplementary Feeding for Children, and supervised neighborhood play for children in the evacuation centers
- Conducted CISD to 232 released hostages
- As of 23 September 2013, a total of 200 DSWD Staff were deployed to Zamboanga City to provide support/assistance to the ongoing disaster operations
- Set-up another tent for pregnant women and newly-delivered women, catered to 135 women, which provided them space to rest

- National Blood Center (NBC) ensured availability of blood
- Set-up welfare desks in Army General Hospital in Fort Bonifacio and in AFP Medical Center in V. Luna
- PRC and ICRC personnel extended medical assistance to 888 IDPs, provided 25,500 packs of cooked food meals, and installed 500 liters water bladder to provide continuous water supply to the evacuation centers
- Provided ambulance services to the victims
- Augmented 200 units of blood supply; continuously providing health services (medical consultations, wound dressing, nebulization hydration, dispensing of medicines and patient referral); installed one (1) dispensary (Swiss Tent) in JFEMSC
- Set-up an emergency health station to cater different medical problems and health promotions to the evacuees

PRC Zamboanga City

- Set-up first aid stations and welfare desks; deployed four (4) vehicles; and set-up a water bladder, tap stand, and tent for the distribution of water supply to the evacuees in the Grandstand and JFEMSC Evacuation Centers in coordination with International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and Zamboanga Water District (ZCWD)
- Provided health services at the JFEMSC evacuation center
- Mobilized all Red Cross vehicles for the transportation of the victims to Western Mindanao State University (WMSU) Satellite Hospital
- With ICRC personnel, extended medical assistance to 888 IDPs; provided a total of 25,000 packs of cooked food meals and installed 500 liters of water bladder to support continuous water supply in the evacuation area
- In coordination with DOH-CHD IX and Zamboanga City Health Office, set-up an Emergency Health Station to cater the different medical problems and health promotions to the evacuees

UNFPA

- Sent two (2) reproductive health kits 2A (clean delivery kits) with medicines that can provide safe and clean deliveries to 400 pregnant women in their last trimester
- Conducted rapid assessment in the evacuation centers through Family Planning Organization of the Philippines (FPOP) and local partners

- Provided dental supplies, cadaver bags, assorted drugs and medicines at JFEMSC

- Conducted health education, health promotions activities on safe water, sanitation and hygiene from 10 - 18 September 2013

Office of the City Environment and Natural Resources (OCENR)

- Handled Solid Waste Management and provided bins; deployed sweepers around evacuation centers

DepEd

- Conducted psychosocial interventions to the affected DepEd personnel, teachers, and school children

F. Logistics and Emergency Telecommunication

OCD IX

- In coordination with UN-OCHA, conducted Rapid Needs Assessment on 18 September 2013
- Conducted a Post Disaster Conflict Needs Analysis together with RDRRMC IX members and key personnel, and other stakeholders

DTI

- Coordinated with the Philippine Chamber of Food Manufacturers and manufacturers of canned sardines to ensure sufficient supply of basic goods and with Mr. Cezar Cruz of Columbus Seafoods regarding the supply of canned sardines in Zamboanga City
- Monitored the prices of basic necessities and prime commodities, and posting of suggested retail prices in different groceries/convenient stores
- Monitored/reported the following:
 - ✓ Some Pharmaceutical stores provided priority lanes to the elderly, infirmed and handicapped persons. No reported price increase on medicines
 - ✓ Cannery operations resumed operations
