I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

• Southwest monsoon affecting Central and Southern Luzon and Visayas.

II. EFFECTS

A. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB A)

- A total of <u>122,412 families / 584,730 persons</u> were affected in <u>325</u> barangays in <u>32</u> municipalities and <u>11</u> cities in <u>6</u> provinces of Regions III, IV-A, and NCR
- Out of the total affected, <u>27,393 families / 123,301 persons</u> were displaced and currently served inside and outside evacuation centers

Inside <u>103</u> evacuation centers: Outside evacuation centers: 4,869 families / 20,753 persons 18,352 families / 86,186 persons

 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective Areas of Responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
 - Accepted the offer of the U.S. Government for response assets, food, and non food items
