## I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

""NONA" has further weakened into Tropical Depression.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 250 km diameter of the tropical depression.
- Flashfloods and landslides are expected over low-lying and mountainous areas of Zambales. Aurora and the regions of Cagayan and CAR.
- PSWS elsewhere has now been lifted. The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at 11 AM today.

#### II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 20 re
   Tropical Depression "NONA" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and
   facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their
   respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs)
   from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
