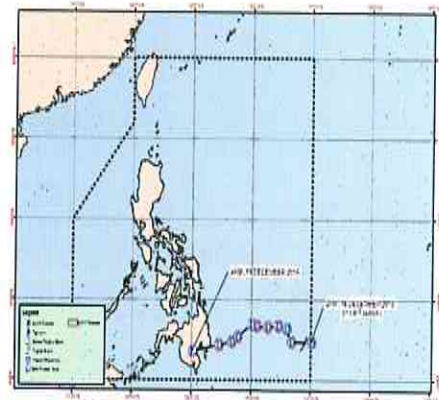

### **I. OVERVIEW**

#### **A. Chronology and Tropical Depression Track**

##### **16 December 2015**

The Tropical Depression East of Mindanao has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "ONYOK". At 10:00 PM, "ONYOK" slightly intensified as it moved in westward direction towards Eastern Mindanao.



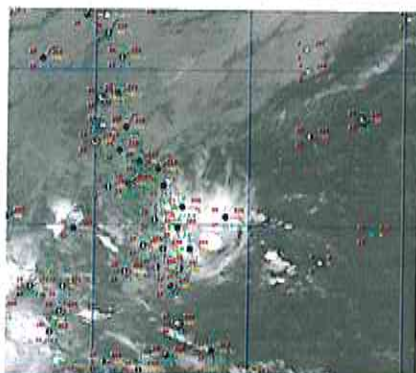
##### **17 December 2015**

"Onyok" has maintained its strength as it poses a threat over CARAGA Region. Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) No. 1 was raised in Surigao del Sur including Siargao Island, Surigao del Norte, Dinagat Province, Misamis Oriental, Camiguin, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao del Norte, Compostela Valley, Bukidnon, Lanao del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Misamis Occidental, Davao del Sur and North Cotabato.

##### **18 December 2015**

"ONYOK" has made landfall over Caraga / Manay, Davao Oriental and has weakened into a Low Pressure Area (LPA). The provinces of Zamboanga del Norte, Zamboanga del Sur, Zamboanga Sibugay, northern part of Davao Occidental, Sultan Kudarat, Maguindanao, and the northern part of South Cotabato, were added to the areas placed under PSWS No. 1. On the same day, "ONYOK" weakened into a low pressure area.

#### **B. Tropical Depression Analysis**



"ONYOK" as a weak tropical depression has entered the PAR in the afternoon of 16 December 2015. It slightly intensified as it continued to move almost west direction closer to Eastern Mindanao. "ONYOK" has made landfall over Caraga / Manay, Davao Oriental and weakened into a LPA on the late evening of 18 December 2015.



TD "ONYOK" brought moderate to heavy rains in major parts of Mindanao. During its stay from 16 to 18 December 2015, its highest maximum sustained winds attained was recorded at 55 kph near the center.

## II. DISASTER PREVENTION AND MITIGATION

### NDRRMC OPERATIONS CENTER

1. Disseminated Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warnings, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
2. Issued Severe Weather Bulletins:
  - a. No. 1 and 2 on 16 December 2015
  - b. No. 3, 4, and 5 on 17 December 2015
  - c. No. 6, 7, 8, and 9 (Final) on 18 December 2015

## III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

### A. Pre-emptive evacuation (Tab A)

1. A total of 3,894 families/18,402 persons were pre-emptively evacuated in Regions X, XI, and CARAGA

### B. NDRRMC Operations Center

1. Conducted a Full Council Meeting regarding TD "ONYOK" and TY "NONA" at 2:00 PM, 17 December 2015 at the NDRRMC Conference Room, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City. The meeting was presided by the SND and Chairperson, NDRRMC Voltaire T. Gazmin. The C, NDRRMC directed all member agencies to be on full alert for any possibilities in relation to TD "ONYOK".
2. Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting was conducted on 18 December 2015, 10:00 AM at the NDRRMC Building, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City, presided by Executive Director, NDRRMC USec Alexander P. Pama.

### C. Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP)

1. Issued directive to all Unified Commands and major services to keep track of the typhoon and monitor landslide and flood-prone areas and to conduct pre-emptive evacuation, proactive measures, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Response (HADR) operations in coordination with Local Government Units (LGUs) and LDRRMCs within their respective area of responsibility (AOR) if situation warrants.

#### AFP VI

1. All assets are ready for deployment.

#### AFP XI

1. All units with rescue teams are on standby.
2. Assisted in the pre-emptive evacuation.

#### AFP CARAGA

1. 29IB, PA on standby, ready for deployment.
2. Philippine Navy alerted Philippine Naval Reservist for possible augmentation on water rescue and relief operations with following standby assets:
  - PG 739
  - PG 385
  - DF 350
  - 2 IRB
  - 40 Naval Reservist



#### **D. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)**

1. Ensured the availability of fire personnel, apparatus, and auxilliary units and directed all BFP personnel to be ready to extend necessary assistance if situation warrants.

##### **BFP CARAGA**

1. Activated Regional BFP Oplan Paghahanda Laban Sa Sakuna (PAGHALASA).
2. Conducted fire truck visibility, "Bandilyo" (public announcement of warning thru a crier), and "Recoreda" (rounds/patrolling) at the municipal level.
3. Assisted in the conduct of pre-emptive evacuation.
4. Monitored flood-prone areas for possible rescue operations.

##### **BFP XI**

1. Rescue teams are on standby.

#### **E. Department of Education (DepEd)**

1. DepEd Disaster Risk Reduction Management Service (DRRMS) is closely monitoring TD "ONYOK" and its effects to concerned offices and schools.
2. Deployed DRRMS Staff at NDRRM Operations Center and participated in PDRA Meetings; and disseminated DOST-PAGASA's weather briefing presentations to Field Offices
3. DRRMS Staff sent-out the following information to all DepEd Local Officials and DRRM Coordinators via InfoBoard textblast:
  - a. Weather advisories
  - b. Advisory regarding pre-emptive measures to be undertaken in preparation for TD "ONYOK"
  - c. Reminders to Field Offices regarding reporting of schools used as evacuation centers for TD "ONYOK" to all DepEd Local Officials and DRRM Coordinators via InfoBoard textblast.

##### **DEPED CARAGA**

1. Disseminated PAGASA weather bulletins to DepEd personnel through DepEd InfoBoard System.
2. Sent-out Regional Memorandum regarding Monitoring and Preparation for the Tropical Depression.

#### **F. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)**

1. Informed concerned Local Chief Executive (LCEs) and LDRRMOs of Local Government Units (LGUs) regarding TD "ONYOK" through personal calls, text blasts, and email.
2. Advised LGUs to activate pre-disaster monitoring.
3. Directed LCEs to comply with disaster preparedness protocols.
4. Provided constant updates to LCEs and LDRRMOs of LGUs.

##### **DILG VI**

1. Activated the disaster monitoring and working system.
2. Alerted the LDRRMCs in their AOR.

##### **DILG XI**

1. Assisted in the dissemination of advisories to P/C/MDRRMCs identified as highly susceptible to flashflood/flood/landslide.

##### **DILG XII**

1. Assisted in the dissemination of weather and warning advisories to all LGUs.
2. Closely monitors the LGUs through OPLAN LISTO.



### **DILG CARAGA**

1. Activated Disaster Monitoring System for Tropical Depression "Onyok" effective 16 December 2015.
2. Issued Regional Order 2015-92 activating DILG XIII (CARAGA) Regional Disaster Monitoring System to ensure Local DRRM Councils' appropriate actions and for field officers to be at their respective stations religiously coordinating with their respective Local Chief Executives.

### **G. Department of Health (DOH)**

1. Issued alert memorandum to all regions.
2. Checked adequacy of prepositioned medicines and logistics.
3. Ensured availability of standby medical teams in the Regional and Provincial DOH Offices and retained hospitals.
4. Reminded Regional and Provincial DOH Offices to attend DRRM and other coordination meetings.
5. Continuously monitors weather situation through PAGASA and provision of the same to Regional and Provincial Offices.
6. Operations Center is on 24/7 monitoring together with standby response teams.

1. All affected Regional Offices activated their respective Operations Centers.
2. Standby medical teams are in placed in all affected Regional Offices and their retained hospital with prepositioned medicines and other logistics.
3. Continuously coordinates with RDRMC and other agencies.

#### **DOH CARAGA**

1. Activated Regional Operations Center.
2. Issued Code White Alert Memorandum to all Provincial DOH Office, PHO, and CHO.
3. Prepositioned medicines to PHOs, PHTs and LGUs.
4. Medical Teams are on standby.
5. Prepositioned P2.5 Million of medicines in warehouse and P500,000.00 worth of Jerry Cans (789 pcs).

### **H. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)**

#### **DPWH XI**

1. To provide logistical support whenever needed.
2. Prepositioned heavy equipment for possible road and debris clearing.

#### **DPWH CARAGA**

1. Agusan del Sur DPWH 1<sup>st</sup> Engineering District maintenance team is on standby.

### **I. Department of Education (DepEd)**

1. Issued DepEd Order No. 9 s 2015 "School Calendar for School Year 2015-2016". School break for elementary and secondary schools will commence on 19 December 2015.
2. Continuously sends weather advisories to all DepEd Local Officials and DRRM Coordinators.



**DepED VI**

1. Identified schools to be used as evacuation centers in collaboration with Local DRRMCs.

**DepED CARAGA**

1. Disseminated PAGASA Weather Bulletins to all DepEd Personnel through DepEd Information Board System.
2. Sent-out Regional memorandum re Monitoring and Preparation for Tropical Depression "ONYOK".

**J. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)**

1. Prepositioned a total of **₱673,565,266.67 standby funds**, **204,665 family food packs**, and **₱111,501,055.70 worth of food and non-food items** available at the Field Offices in Regions X, XI, XII, CARAGA, and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) **as of 18 December 2015**:

**DSWD VI**

1. Prepositioned relief goods and have 30,661 family food packs composed of assorted canned goods and noodles available
2. Allocated Quick Response Fund (QRF) amounting to ₱5,726,500.
3. Standby stocks of 130 sacks of rice for the 1<sup>st</sup> District of Iloilo and 25 kilos of rice/family for island barangays.

**DSWD X**

1. Quick Response Teams are continuously monitoring the situation within the AOR and are on standby.

1. Has sufficient rice stocks for distribution in difference province in the region.

##### **NFA XI**

1. On standby to provide rice as need arises and to ensure rice availability.

#### **M. Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)**

1. Continuously monitors the situation and disseminates Weather Advisories, Severe Weather Bulletins, Gale Warnings, General Flood Advisories, and 24-hour Public Weather Forecast.

#### **N. Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)**

1. Advised all PCG units to ensure strict implementation of HPCG Memorandum Circular Number 02-13 (Guidelines on Movement of Vessels during Heavy Weather).
2. Deployable Resource Groups (DRGs), floating assets, and all necessary response equipment are on standby for possible dispatch.

##### **Coast Guard District – Western Visayas (CGD-WV)**

1. Enforced suspension of voyage of all types of vessels/watercrafts bound for Mindanao area in compliance with of HPCG Memorandum Circular Number 02-13.
2. All stations on heightened alert.



3. Advised fishermen not to venture out into the sea.
4. Regional Teams composed of 7 personnel are on standby; ready for deployment.

#### **PCG CARAGA**

1. Issued "No Sail Policy".

#### **O. Philippine National Police (PNP)**

1. Informed all Police Regional Offices to prepare assets and coordinate with LGUs and other force multipliers in their AORs.

##### **PNP VI**

1. Directed all municipal stations to be on full alert status and coordinate with their local MDRRMC.
2. Standby of one (1) company from their technical support platoon, two (2) Military Police (MP) Truck35, three (3) 6x6 trucks and SAR equipment.

##### **PNP XI**

1. Compostela Valley PPO rescue team is on standby. Assisted LDRRMC in the conduct of preemptive evacuation.

##### **PNP XII**

1. Alerted Search and Rescue Groups of Provincial and City Police Offices.

#### **PNP CARAGA**

1. On standby for possible augmentation and deployment.

#### **P. Philippine Information Agency (PIA)**

##### **PIA VI**

1. Continuous usage of their TextPlus program to relay information and answer queries.
2. Utilized their Infoboard and social media accounts in posting relevant information to help people in preparing for possible disaster.
3. Provides daily updates through their website and local newspaper.

#### **Q. Philippine Red Cross (PRC)**

1. Emergency Response Teams are on standby.

#### **R. REGIONAL / RDRRMC**

1. RDRRMC/OCD Regional Centers VI, IX, XI, XII, CARAGA, and ARMM are on Alert Status to continuously disseminates weather advisories to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) though OCDRC Infoboard Text Blast System, and upload the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty; alerted and closely coordinates with all RDRRMCs and PDRRMC member-agencies for possible rescue, relief, and other response operations relative to the weather disturbance; and continuously monitors the situation in their respective AORs.
2. RDRRMC / OCD Regional Centers VI, X, XI, CARAGA, and ARMM conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) meeting in preparation for the entry and possible effects of TD "ONYOK".

#### **I. RDRRMC / OCD VI**

##### **1. PDRRMC Guimaras**

- a. On alert status to closely monitor the effects of TD "ONYOK" in their AOR.
- b. Issued warnings to barangays particularly those in the coastal areas through text messaging.
- c. Has stockpiles readily-available.
- d. Conducted PDRRMC Emergency Meeting re Preparations for Tropical Depression "ONYOK".

- e. Alerted MDRRMCs and BDRRMCs.
- f. Response Teams and equipment on standby.
- 2. **PDRRMCs Aklan, Antique, Capiz, and Iloilo**
  - a. Closely monitors their respective AOR.
- 3. **PDRRMCs Antique, Iloilo and Capiz and CDRRMC Iloilo**
  - a. Placed on standby alert.
  - b. Local Response Teams on standby.
- 4. **PDRRMC Capiz**
  - a. OpCen continuously monitors weather situation, water level and amount of rainfall in the whole province.
- 5. **PDRRMC Iloilo and CDRRMC Iloilo City**
  - a. Rescue volunteers are prepositioned and on standby.

## **II. RDRRMC / OCD NIR**

- a. Disseminated weather advisories to PDRRMC and LDRRMCs through text messaging.
- b. Continuously monitors weather updates.
- 1. **PDRRMC Negros Occidental**
  - a. Continuously monitors the amount of rainfall observed in different LGUs through local automated warning system.
- 2. **PDRRMC Negros Oriental**
  - a. Disseminated weather advisories and alerted LDRRMCs to take precautionary measures.

## **III. RDRRMC / OCD IX**

- a. Advised PDRRMO Zamboanga del Norte Ato convene the council regarding the weather disturbance.
- b. Coordinated with; DOST-PAGASA in relation to the threat of TD "ONYOK" and PDRRMOs of Zamboanga del Sur and Zamboanga Sibugay for up-to-date weather-related incidents
- 1. **PDRRMC ZAMBOANGA DEL NORTE**
  - a. Gov. Uy convened the Executive Committee of PDRRMC on 17 December 2015. The agenda focused on the possible effects of TD "ONYOK" and the needed preparatory measures.
  - b. Planning Division of PDRRMO convened for the prepositioning of response assets.
  - c. Continuously monitors the weather situation in the whole province.
- 2. **PDRRMC ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY**
  - a. Provided warning advisory to all municipalities thru radio messages.
  - b. Continuously monitors the weather situation in the whole province.
- 3. **PDRRMC ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR**
  - a. Coordinated with flood-prone municipalities to monitor the situation and provide report/updates.
  - b. Continuously monitors the weather situation in the whole province.
- 4. **CDRRMC ZAMBOANGA CITY**
  - a. Advised the residents along the riverbanks, low-lying areas, mountainous areas, and coastal areas to take precautionary measures.
  - b. Urged BDRRMCs to be on alert and to monitor weather-related incidents in their AOR.



#### **IV. RDRRMC / OCD X**

- a. Disseminated up-to-date warning bulletins to RDRRMC Member Agencies and LDRRMCs.
- b. Conducted two (2) PDRA Core Group Meetings on 17 and 18 December 2015, respectively.
- c. Alerted Response Teams all over the region.
- d. RDRRMC Member Agencies continuously monitoring the situation of the Local DRRMCs.
- e. Raised BLUE ALERT Status as well as in the lower DRRMCs.

##### **1. PDRRMC BUKIDNON**

- a. Constant monitoring of weather condition.

###### **1.1 CDRRMC Malaybalay**

- a. Activation of CDRRMC Operations Center and 46 BDRRMC Operations Centers
- b. All responders are on alert status
- c. Information-dissemination of weather advisories
- d. Identified and alerted flood-prone areas (18 Barangays) priority for pre-emptive evacuation

###### **1.2 CDRRMC Valencia**

- a. Continuously monitors the situation within the AOR.

- b. Identified and alerted flood-prone areas (12 Barangays) priority for pre-emptive evacuation (4 barangays in Mambajao, 6 barangays in Sagay, and 2 barangays in Mahinog)
- c. Continuously monitors the situation within the AOR.

##### **3. PDRRMC LANA DEL NORTE**

- a. Information-dissemination of weather advisories.
- b. Identified and alerted flood-prone areas (11 Barangays) priority for pre-emptive evacuation.
- c. Continuously monitors AOR specially flood and landslide-prone areas.

##### **4. PDRRMC MISAMIS OCCIDENTAL**

- a. Conducted PDRA; constant monitoring of weather updates; response services and radio communications organizations already on standby.
- b. Continuously monitors the weather and the situation within the AOR.

###### **4.1 CDRRMC Oroquieta**

- a. Conducted PDRA
- b. All vehicles already on standby for possible conduct of pre-emptive evacuation
- c. CSWD already prepared family food packs
- d. Identified and alerted flood-prone areas (8 Barangays) priority for pre-emptive evacuation
- e. Continuously monitors the situation within the AOR.

###### **4.2 CDRRMC Ozamiz**

- a. Implemented Incident Command System and activation of Early Warning System (EWS) and Evacuation Centers (ECs)
- b. Weather monitoring and updating
- c. Strengthened information education campaign and public advisory
- d. Prohibited fishing boat/vessel to venture at sea while PSWS is hoisted over Ozamiz City
- e. Possible conduct/implementation of pre-emptive evacuation
- f. Continuously monitors the situation within the AOR.



#### **4.3 MDRRMC Sinacaban**

- a. Responders and rescue vehicles on standby
- b. Constant monitoring of upland barangays
- c. Identified and alerted flood-prone areas (6 Barangays) priority for pre-emptive evacuation

### **5. PDRRMC MISAMIS ORIENTAL**

- a. Closely monitoring the situation and on standby alert.
- b. PDRRMO under Code Blue Alert; sent letter to Local MDRRMOs to be prepared in any eventualities and to ensure safety of communities especially those in low-lying areas; identified and alerted flood-prone and landside-prone areas (3 Cities and 17 Municipalities).
- c. Continuously monitors all riverine and landslide-prone areas in the province.

- a. On Orange Alert Status effective 18 December 2015, 2:00 PM

- e. Advised to conduct pre-emptive evacuation of low-lying areas

## V. DISASTER RESPONSE

1. NDRRM Operations Center maintains Red Alert status at the NDRRM Operations Center since 13 December 2015, 12:00 NN.
