I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern Luzon, while tail-end of a cold front affecting the eastern section of Central and Southern Luzon.

Cloudy skies with moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms which may trigger flashfloods and landslides will be experienced over the Provinces of Aurora and Quezon while light to moderate rains is expected over Isabela and Bicol region. Cloudy skies with light rains will prevail over Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms will prevail over Visayas and Mindanao.

Moderate to strong winds blowing from the northeast will prevail over Luzon and Visayas and coming from the northeast to north over Mindanao. The coastal waters throughout the archipelago will be moderate to rough.

II. DISASTER PREVENTION AND MITIGATION:

- 1. Philippine Geophysical, and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)
 - a. Continuously monitors the situation and disseminates Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecast and Heavy Rainfall Warnings.

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS:

1. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC)

a. Maintained Red Alert status at the NDRRM Operations Center since 13 December 2015 to continuously monitor and ensure dissemination of Weather Advisories and 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal level.

2. Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) GHQ

a. OJ3 directed SOLCOM, NOLCOM, Major Services and JTF-NCR to alert their respective HADR assets for possible HADR operations regarding the continuous monsoon in NCR and other adjacent provinces.

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- a. The Local Social Welfare and Development Officers (LSWDOs) are continuously providing assistance to the affected families.
- b. Activated Disaster Management Response team (DMRT), Social Welfare and Development Teams (SWADTs) and Provincial/Municipal Action Teams (P/MATs) to monitor the status of the affected areas and produce reports.
- c. The Field office (FO) has enough Family Food Packs (FFPs) ready for augmentation.
- 4. OCD-RDRRMCs IV-A, VII, and NCR disseminated weather advisories and heavy rainfall advisory to concerned LDRRMOs through SMS and facsimile and uploaded the same to media accounts to ensure widest dissemination of these advisories, and continuously monitor the weather situation in their AORs and untoward incidents

a. OCD IV-A

- 1) Raised its alert status to Red effective 19 December 2015.
- 2) Disseminated of reminder to Local Disaster Risk Reduction and re landslide prone areas

b. OCD-RDRRMC VII

- 1) OCD VII is on Red Alert Status and continuously monitors the weather situation within AOR
- Local Social Welfare and Development Office provided relief items for IDPs in Candijay, Bohol

5. PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION:

a. A total of **1,080 families / 4,792 persons** were pre-emptively evacuated in the provinces of Laguna, Cavite, Quezon and Bohol due to Northeast Monsoon.
