1. Belated Report re Fire Incident in Quiapo, Manila (NCR)

A. Situation Overview:

- At 7:05 PM, 01 March 2016, a fire incident occurred at No. 989 Arlegui St., Quaipo, Manila involving two (2) apartments
- The fire reached Task Force Charlie and the fire was declared fire-out at 4:54 AM, 02 March 2016

B. Effects:

- Approximately 173 families/865 individuals were affected and evacuated in Tanduary Covered Courtin Quiapo, Manila as validation of victims are still ongoing
- A total of four (4) individuals sustained minor injuries:
 1. SFO3 Delfin Labong
 2. FO1 Revy de Ocampo
 3. FO1 Jomar Rivera
 4. Jayson Torsuela
- The estimated cost of damage to property amounted to ₱2,000,000.00

C. Actions Taken:

- BFP District 1 and other fire trucks of nearby cities, fire brigade volunteers, and emergency medical responders responded to the incident.
- OCD-NCR coordinated with BFP District 1, FD1 Arson Unit, and Manila DRRMO for updates on the incident

2. Progress Report re Maritime Incident in Gumaca, Quezon (Region IV-A)

A. Situation Overview:

- Due to strong winds and big waves brought by the northeast monsoon, a motorized banca (MBCA) identified as Lady Aimee, capsized on or about 3:30 PM, 26 February 2016, at vicinity one (1) nautical mile from the shoreline of Gumaca, Quezon as reported by Coast Guard Sub-Station Gumaca

- The banca was loaded with seventy (70) persons enroute from Gumaca, Quezon to Quezon, Quezon
- **As of 29 February 2016, MBCA Lady Aimee is still in the vicinity of the incident area. No towing operations was conducted due to unfavorable weather condition**

B. Effects:

- A total of three (3) individuals were reported dead and 67 were rescued on the incident:

C. Actions Taken:

- PCG Sub-Station Gumaca and community volunteers immediately conducted search and rescue (SAR) operations
- PDRMO Quezon coordinated with MDRMO Gumaca regarding the SAR operations
- Station Commander, CGS Southern Luzon had a meeting with local chief executives and MDRRM Officers of Gumaca and Quezon on the legal implications of the incident, and directed its field station to conduct investigation
- **Marine Casualty Investigating Team from Maritime Safety Service Command (MSSC) aboard CGS-Southern Quezon conducted investigation**

3. Progress Report re Fire Incident in Calaca, Batangas (Region IV-A)

A. Situation Overview:

- On or about 4:21PM, 20 February 2016, a fire incident transpired inside the Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) factory owned by the Southern Pacific Inc., one of the locators in the Phoenix Petroleum Depot, Calaca, Batangas
- The fire reached general alarm
- The fire was declared under control at 12:55 PM, 21 February 2016
- The cause of fire is still under investigation
- **As of 09:34 PM, 01 March 2016, the fire in Tank No. 2 was declared fire-out**

B. Effects:

- As of 23 February 2016, 3:00 PM, a total of 295 families / 1,126 individuals were affected in Barangays Salong and Camastilisan and are currently staying in seven (7) evacuation centers (Calaca Central School, Dacanlao Agoncillo National High School, Mormons Church, Madalunot Elementary School, Puting Bato Elementary School, Bagong Tubig Club House, and Matipok Elementary School)
- Three (3) persons suffered minor injuries and brought to the following hospitals for medical treatment:

- The municipality of Calaca, Batangas was declared under State of Emergency on 21 February 2016, 6:30 PM with Resolution Number 16-07 s. 2016

C. Actions Taken:

- A total of 29 BFP IV-A fire trucks with 135 personnel, 29 fire volunteers, nine (9) LGU fire trucks, five (5) ambulances from LGU Calaca and PRC, and other response groups (DREVAN and WRECKER) responded in the incident
- PDRRMO Batangas closely monitoring and coordinating with the responding agencies
- PRC Batangas distributed food packs to the affected families
- BFP IV-A alerted all provincial, city, and municipal fire stations and personnel for possible deployment and conducted gas testing
- DSWD IV-A conducted RDANA and distributed food and non-food items to the affected families
- BFP IV-A continuously conducting cover exposure and cooling of the area
- PCG-STL Info Sub-station and MEPU-STL launched aluminum boat (AB-281) to conduct survey and alerted Waterborne Industry Spill Emergency (WISE) Batangas and are closely monitoring the incident
- DSWD IV-A closely coordinating with MSWDO Calaca on the status of affected families in the evacuation centers
- LGU Calaca conducting regular monitoring in the evacuation centers
- OCDRC IV-A is continuously monitoring the incident and closely coordinating with BFP IV-A and BFP Batangas for further updates on the incident
- As of 02 March 2015, a total of four (4) BFP-IV-A fire trucks, nine (9) fire volunteers, one (1) Fire Truck of LGU Calaca, one (1) ambulance of Philippine Red Cross, and one (1) DREVAN-R4A rescue fire truck were deployed in the area

4. Chemical Leakage Incident in Carmona Cavite (Region IV-A)

A. Situation Overview:

- On or about 6:30 AM, 02 March 2016, a chemical (ammonia) leakage incident transpired at Polytrade Sales and Services Inc. located in Goldenmile Business Park, Barangay Maduya, Carmona, Cavite
- At 7:40 AM, on the same date, the chemical leakage was already contained

B. Effects:

- A total of 40 unidentified employees were injured due to chemical inhalation and were brought to Pagamutang Bayan ng Carmona, University of Perpetual Help Hospital in Biñan City, and UniHealth Hospital in San Pedro City

C. Actions Taken:

- MDRRMO Carmona and Carmona Fire Station responded to the incident
- MDRRMO Carmona forced evacuated the employees of nearby companies within 250 meters from Polytrade Sales and Services Inc.
- MDRRMO Carmona transported the injured victims to nearby hospitals
- Rescuers from Provincial Rescue Teams, Rural Health Unit (RHU), and Special Rescue Units (SRUs) of BFP IV-A and Province of Carmona were mobilized
- BFP Carmona contained the leakage and conducted flushing operation in the affected areas

- PDRRMO Cavite deployed two (2) rescue teams from Trece Martires and Imus City to Carmona
- OCD IV-A continuously coordinates with BFP IV-A and MDRRMO Carmona for updates on the incident

5. Progress Report re Fire Incident in Bacolod City, Negros Occidental (NIR)

A. Situation Overview:

- At 8:18 AM, 01 March 2016, a fire incident occurred at Purok Riverside, Zone 3, Barangay Banago, Bacolod City, Negros Occidental involving residential houses
- The said fire originated in the residence of spouses Lemuel and MarichuNobleza. The cause of fire is still under investigation
- The fire reached 5th Alarm and the fire was declared out at 10:23 AM of the same day

B. Effects:

- A total of nine (9) persons were injured of which seven (7) victims sustained minor lacerated injured while the other two (2) persons were transported to Corazon Locsin Montelibano Memorial Regional Hospital, namely:

- **A total of 188 families / 792 individuals were affected**
- **A total of 182 houses were damaged, of which, 161 were totally damaged and 21 were partially damaged**
- The estimated cost of damaged to property amounted to ₱700,000.00.

C. Actions Taken:

- A total of 19 fire suppression units responded to the incident: Bacolod City Fire Station (6), Chamber Volunteer Fire Brigade (3), Amity Volunteer Fire Brigade (3), Silay City Fire Station (1), Talisay Fire Station (1), EB Magalona Fire Station (1), Victorias City Fire Station (1), Bago City Fire Station (1), San Enrique Fire Station (1), and Tanduary Distillery Fire (1 Tanker)
- A total of 12 EMS and rescue units also responded in the incident, namely; Chamber Volunteer Fire Brigade (1 unit Ambulance), Amity Volunteer Fire Brigade (1 unit Ambulance), Silay City Rescue Units, CERT – Bacolod City, Bacolod City DRRMO EMS and Rescue, Handumanan EMS and Rescue, DYA EMS and Rescue, Chamber EMS and Rescue, CROPER Rescue – Mansilingan, CHO – HEMS Team, and BACIWA Rescue Unit (BERU)
- DSWD provided family food packs and extended immediate relief assistance (e.i. Community kitchen)
- Bacolod City DRRMC inspected and established evacuation center at Domingo Lacson NHS as well as prepositioned canopy tents
- CHO-HEMS conducted medical consultations and distributed jerry cans to the victims
- Bacolod City Water District (BACIWA) provided 1 trailer truck load of potable water
