I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The annual observance of Semana Santa brings forth a volume of traveling population to the provinces and places of worship. The expected high density movement of traveling public increases the vulnerability of people to several human-induced hazards. In this regard, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) and member-agencies implemented initiatives and operational plans to achieve a casualty-free Lenten Season.

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) - Metro Manila Engineering Office advised the repair of the following road sections along EDSA during the Holy Week, namely:

- EDSA northbound between Madison Street San Juan City and Ortigas Avenue, Mandaluyong City
- EDSA southbound between Ortigas flyover and Boni Avenue

II. INCIDENTS MONITORED (Tab A)

A total of **sixty-one** (60) incidents were monitored in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, VII, X, XI, and CAR. **Thirty-six** (36) of which were vehicular incidents, **three** (3) fire incidents, and **twenty-one** (21) drowning incidents.

III. CASUALTIES (Tab B)

A total of **thirty-two (32)** deaths and **107** injured were reported in Regions I, II, IV-A, IV-B, VII, X, XI and CAR.

IV. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. NATIONAL / NDRRMC

1. NDRRM Operations Center

- Issued a memorandum to all Chairpersons, RDRRMCs/OCD Regional Directors on 18 March 2016 directing them to raise their respective operations centers' alert status, continuously monitor their respective area of responsibilities (AORs), report any untoward incidents to the NDRRM Operations Center, and undertake precautionary measures if situation warrants. Likewise, a memorandum was sent to NDRRMC Member Agencies to monitor, record, document, consolidate, and report all related incidents with various activities and actions taken by their agency and local offices in their respective AORs and to submit their preparedness measures report and the corresponding situational report/update thereon. A text message was also disseminated to NDRRMC member agencies and RDRRMCs/OCDRCs to that effect.
- Consequently, representatives from AFP, PNP, BFP, and PCG were required to render duty at the NDRRMOC as Detailed Duty Officers (DDOs) to ensure continuous coordination.
- Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting on 21 March 2016 at the NDRRMC Conference Room to discuss the preparations for the Observance of Semana Santa 2016 attended by representatives from DOST-PAGASA, DOST-PHIVOLCS, DILG, DSWD, DENR-MGB, DOH, DOTC, DPWH, MMDA, OCD-NCR, LTFRB, PCG, PIA, AFP, BFP, and PNP. Subsequently, a press briefing was conducted.
- The NDRRM Operations Center was raised to BLUE ALERT status, effective at 5:00 PM, 23 March 2016, with representatives from AFP, PNP, BFP, and PCG rendering duty for prompt coordination and monitoring.
- Developed and distributed "Operations for Semana Santa 2016 Emergency Hotline" to NDRRMC Member Agencies and RDRRMCs/OCDRCs for reference and further dissemination.

2. Department of Science and Technology (DOST)

Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

- Provided NDRRM Operations Center with Weather Bulletins / Advisories.
- Local PAGASA disseminated weather advisories to RDRRMC member agencies.

3. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)

a. Advised Provincial Directors, City Directors, and City/Municipal Local Government Operations Officers to coordinate closely with Local Chief Executives, Chief of Police, and Fire Marshalls to ensure their readiness to provide first response in case of emergencies.

Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)

- a. Directed all Regional Offices to activate their respective stations and to ensure the availability of fire, rescue, emergency, and medical personnel, apparatus, and auxiliary units.
- b. Placed all Regional Offices and Fire Stations on Heightened Alert Status (Code BLUE) effective on 23 March 2016, 8:00 AM.

- c. Placed all officers and key personnel of BFP Offices standby to extend assistance in case of emergencies and other eventualities.
- d. Established command post for "OPLAN Semana Santa and Lakbay Alalay 2016" within respective AOR.
- e. Placed all operating units on standby for prompt and effective delivery of fire safety, recue, and emergency medical services.
- f. All Fire Districts scheduled roving activities in their respective area of responsibilities (AORs) on Holy Thursday and Good Friday.
- g. Deployed Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel and ambulances to provide medical assistance in areas of convergence.
- h. Susana Heights, Muntinlupa and Caloocan EMS to provide motorist assistance along South Luzon Expressway (SLEX) and North Luzon Expressway (NLEX).
- i. Distributed Fire Prevention and Education Campaign materials to public and private vehicle operators/drivers imparting safety tips/measures about vehicular fire.
- j. Posted IEC materials on Fire Prevention in fire-prone areas.
- k. Placed other response units, ambulances, and personnel on heightened status to monitor activities within their AOR and to assist in fire response operations.
- I. Fire trucks from district offices conducted roving activities within its AOR considered to be fire-prone areas.

Philippine National Police (PNP)

- a. Implemented "Ligtas SUMVAC 2016".
- b. Established a total of 2,252 Police Assistance Desks/Centers for land, water, and airport transport manned by 10,707 personnel to ensure public order and safety.

4. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

a. Made available, a total of ₱527,767,180.16 worth of family food packs, food and non-food items, and standby funds at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC) and Field Offices.

5. Department of Health (DOH)

- a. Raised Code White Alert to all Regional Health Offices and DOH Hospitals from 20 28 March 2016.
- Health Emergency Management Bureau (HEMB) Operations Center monitored the situation and placed teams on alert in case intervention from DOH is needed.
- c. DOH Central Office coordinated with the Committee Head on Medical Assistance on Special Events of Minor Basilica of Black Nazarene regarding their request for the assistance of four (4) DOH Retained Hospitals namely Tondo Medical Center, Jose Reyes Memorial Medical Center, Dr. Jose Fabella Memorial Hospital, and San Lazaro Hospital on the conduct of Traslacion on Good Friday.
- d. All regional offices placed medical teams on standby for deployment.
- e. HEMB Central Office and all regional offices made available a total of ₱203,586,332.74 worth of assorted drugs and medicines.
- f. Coordinated with health sector and DRRMO counterparts in all levels.

Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP)

- a. All AFP Security and Emergency Preparedness and Response units, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) teams raised their status to RED Alert effective on 22 March 2016 while other AFP units were placed on BLUE Alert status at 5:00 PM, 23 March 2016.
- b. Deployed a total of 158 personnel from 3rd and 8th Infantry Battalion to some areas in Regions VII and VIII.

a. Provided security assistance to PNP Manaoag, Pangasinan.

 - Legible informative and directional signages are installed along national roads
 - Road sections are well maintained and free of potholes
 - Pavement markings are reflectorized to guide night-driving motorists
 - Kilometer posts bear legible details and information to guide motorists and tourists
 - Traffic advisories are properly installed
 - Personnel are available to provide prompt assistance on normal and emergency situations
 - Proper coordination is conducted with concerned government agencies for assistance
- b. Directed all Regional Directors and District Engineers to monitor the strict implementation of Motorist Assistance Program and all department issuance on removal of obstructions along national roads and bridges.

8. Department of Transportation and Communication (DOTC)

Manila International Airport Authority (MIAA)

- Implemented the MIAA Oplan Semana Santa 2016 in compliance to DOTC directive to ensure safe, secured, reliable, and convenient transport system from 18 - 28 March 2016.
- Directed the Airport Police Department Manager to submit a security Implan to include traffic management plan to ensure the smooth flow of vehicular traffic and facilitate the movement of pedestrians at the arrival and departure areas including major road intersections leading to and from the terminals especially at Circulo Del Mundo to mitigate the effects of the ongoing construction of NAIA Expressway Project.

Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)

- a. Activated its Passenger Assistance Centers (PAC) in all ports, harbors, and in areas where heavy influx of passengers are expected.
- b. Coast Guard Action Center (CGAC) provided regular updates to all PCG units regarding the latest weather forecast and gale warnings.
- c. Reminded all District Commanders to strictly adhere to the following proactive measures to ensure orderliness, safety, convenience, and security of sea travellers relative to OPLAN Ligtas Biyahe Semana Santa 2016:
 - Strict implementation of the DOTC Department Guidelines for Preventing Excess Passengers on Board Domestic Vessels and HPCG Memo Circular regarding Guidelines for Checking Unauthorized Persons on Board Domestic Vessels
 - Implementation of Mandatory Pre-Departure Inspection (MPDI) of vessels with emphasis on proper head counting of passengers, inspection of life-saving appliances and fire fighting equipment, and the operational readiness of navigational equipment, machineries, and propulsion
 - Require passengers to wear life jackets after boarding motor bancas or ferries with open decks and windows until they disembark at the port of destination
 - Ensure that no unregulated watercraft will be permitted to operate and advise passengers through intensified public awareness campaign about the risk of patronizing unregulated watercraft that may jeopardize their safety
 - Ensure strict enforcement of vessel safety standards and regulations and implementation of security layers in ports and passengers terminals by deploying K9 units and sea marshals
 - Increase the frequency of shore and seaborne patrol in areas with dense maritime activities
- d. A total of 59,573 outbound passengers and 52,496 inbound passengers were monitored by all PCG districts. Moreover, 276 vessels, and 897 motorized bancas were inspected in different ports nationwide.
- e. Mobilized a total of 1,356 personnel to render duty at CG Stations.

9. National Telecommunication Center

- a. Issued Memorandum Order No. 03-03-2016 on 07 March 2016 addressed to all telecommunications entities to ensure uninterrupted telecommunication services during the Lenten Season.
