I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

- At 10:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) over the West Philippine Sea was estimated at 435 km west of Iba, Zambales (16.1°N, 116.0°E). Meanwhile, another Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside of Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) was spotted at 1,620 km east of Mindanao (5.1°N, 139.8°E). It is expected to develop into a Tropical Depression and will enter PAR within the next 24 hours.
- These two LPAs are embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) which will bring occasional to frequent light to moderate rainshowers and thunderstorms over Palawan, Visayas and Mindanao today and onwards.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated **Weather Advisory No. 02 for Low Pressure Area (LPA)** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
