### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "AMBO" has maintained its strength and is now threatening Aurora Province.

 Estimated rainfall amount is from 2.5 – 10 mm per hour (moderate-heavy) within the 200 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.

- Occasional moderate to heavy rains is expected over Northern and Central Luzon, and the Provinces of Rizal and Quezon. While light to moderate rains is expected over Cavite, Laguna and Batangas.
- TD AMBO is expected to weaken after making landfall over Aurora province early morning tomorrow, 27 June 2016.
- Residents in low lying and mountainous areas of the provinces with TCWS#1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next bulletin to be issued at 2:00 AM tomorrow.

### II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 02 re
   Tropical Depression "AMBO" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and
   facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to
   their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils
   (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
