1. Progress Report re Flashflood Incident in Matalam, Cotabato (Region XII)

A. Situation Overview:

- On 27 June 2016, 8:30 PM, a flashflood incident due to continuous rains transpired and affected eight (8) Puroks in Barangay Poblacion in Matalam, Cotabato.
- At 2:15 AM, 28 June 2016, flashflood likewise affected Barangay Lower Malamote and five (5) Puroks in Barangays Pandan and Taculen, also in Matalam.
- Continuous rise of floodwater in the affected barangays was observed. The Municipality of Matalam was a catch basin of water from the mountainous area of Magpet and Kinapawan City.
- As of 29 June 2016 the floodwaters gradually subsided in some areas. Some affected families from Brgys Lower Malamote and New Pandan have returned to their homes while others have remained in evacuation centers.

B. Effects:

 A total of 484 families were affected in four (4) barangays in the Municipality of Matalam:

C. Actions Taken:

Matalam SAR groups were deployed to evacuate families in low-lying areas.

- LGU of Matalam distributed family food packs to the affected families in the evacuation centers.
- MDRRMC Matalam activated its RDANA Team.
- MDRRMO Matalam prepositioned all their resources and assets for rescue operations.
- Matalam RDANA Team conducts validation and assessment on the affected areas for damages and families affected.
- OCD XII closely coordinates with MDRRMO Matalam for updates
- SAR groups rescued/ assisted the affected families
- Municipal Agriculture Office conducted validation and assessment to the crops damaged and rice field submerged in floodwaters.

2. Progress Report re Flooding in Maguindanao (ARMM)

A. Situation Overview:

 Flooding incident was reported in forty-one (41) barangays in Sultan sa Barongis, Maguindanao due to Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ).

B. Effects:

A total of 9,200 families / 46,000 persons were affected by flooding incident:
