I. SITUATION OVERVIEW CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS

A. Chronology and Tropical Storm Track

17 September 2014

- The Low Pressure Area (LPA) being monitored east of Visayas has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "MARIO", 740km east of Borongan, Eastern Samar (12.2°N, 132.8°E) with maximum sustained winds of 45kph near the center
- On the same day, TD "MARIO" intensified slightly and accelerated as it continued to move over the Philippine Sea at 640 km east of Catarman, Northern Samar with maximum sustained winds of 55kph near the center

18 September 2014

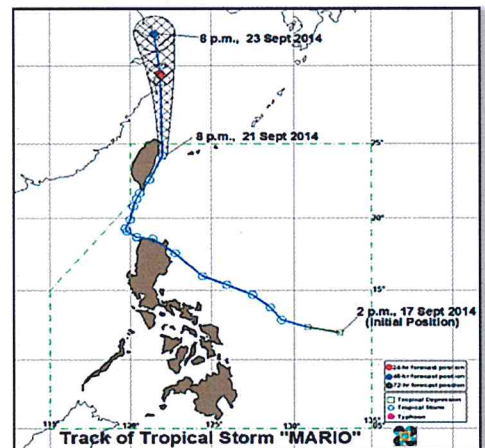
- Tropical Storm "MARIO" has maintained its strength as it moved to Northern Luzon. In the evening, TS "MARIO" moved in a west northwest direction towards Northern Luzon

19 September 2014

- TS "MARIO" has maintained its strength and has made landfall over the Northern tip of Cagayan between 9:00 AM – 10:00 AM
- In the afternoon, TS "MARIO" has slightly weakened while traversing Babuyan Channel and in the evening, it slightly slowed down while moving over the Luzon Strait

20 September 2014

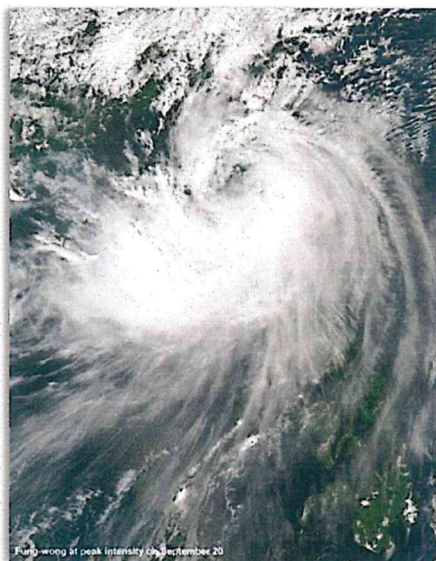
- TS "MARIO" has slightly slowed down and intensified while moving over the Luzon Strait. At around 11:00 AM, it intensified as it moved towards Southern Taiwan



B. Tropical Storm Analysis

TS "MARIO" was a Low Pressure Area (LPA) from Caroline Islands, Pacific Ocean, and was moving west northwest as it entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on 17 September 2014. It developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) inside the PAR in the afternoon of 17 September 2014 and was given a local name "MARIO".



It reached Storm category while over East Philippine Sea and was also given an international name "FUNG-WONG" literally means "Phoenix", a name of peak and contributed by Hong Kong. "MARIO" has crossed Northern Luzon with maximum sustained winds of 85 kph near the center.

Many parts in Luzon and Visayas experienced light to moderate rains though some have recorded moderate to heavy and heavy which caused flashfloods and landslides. Period of Occurrence of TS "MARIO" is from Sep 17 (5pm) - 21 (11pm), 2014 and during the stay of TS "MARIO" inside the PAR, its maximum sustained winds is 105 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 130 kph and Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) No. 2 was the highest in effect to areas affected.

TD "MARIO" is the 3rd tropical cyclone in September and the 13th for the year 2014. It is the 4th tropical cyclone that made landfall / crossed the country after TS "BASYANG" (30 January - 01 February), TY "GLENDA" (13 - 17 July) and TY "LUIS" (12 - 15 September). Further, it is the 2nd tropical cyclone that crossed Northern Luzon, after TY "LUIS". The occurrence of TS "MARIO" within the PAR is considered normal during the season in terms of track and rainfall distribution in the country.

II. EFFECTS

A. Incidents Monitored (Tab A)

A total of **twenty-one (21) incidents** were reported in Regions I, IV-A, and NCR.

B. Affected Population (Tab B)

A total of **453,443 families / 2,053,25 persons** were affected in **2,145 barangays** in **27 provinces** of Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VII, CAR, and NCR

Of the affected population, **39,386 families / 174,904 individuals** were served inside **470 evacuation centers**, while **127,013 families / 588,626 persons** were served outside evacuation centers

C. Casualties (Tab C)

A total of **eighteen (18) persons were reported dead, sixteen (16) injured, and four (4) are missing** in Regions I, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, CAR, and NCR.

D. Status of Lifelines

1. Dams and River

The gates of following dams and river were opened as parts of Luzon and Visayas experienced light to moderate rains and episodes of moderate to heavy rains: Ambuklao, Binga, Ipo, La Mesa, Magat, and Marikina River.

2. Roads and Bridges (Tab D)

A total of **32 roads** and **2 bridges** were affected and closed to traffic due flooding, landslide, soil erosion, and rock falls in Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VII, and CAR.

3. Flooded Areas (Tab E)

Flooding of different depths were reported on several areas of Regions I, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and NCR due to the heavy rainfall brought about by Tropical Storm "Mario".

4. Power

Several areas in Regions I, II, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and CAR experienced power interruptions due to the onslaught of Tropical Storm "Mario":

E. Status of Ports

1. Seaport

A total of **2,480 passengers, 28 vessels, 254 rolling cargoes, and 28 motorized bancas** were reported stranded at Coast Guard District (CGD) Central Visayas, CGD Bicol, CGD NCR - Central Luzon, CGD Southern Tagalog, and CGD Western Visayas due to rough sea condition.

F. Damaged Houses (Tab F)

A total of **11,591 houses (2,256 totally / 9,335 partially)** were damaged in Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, and CAR.

G. Cost of Damages to Infrastructure and Agriculture (Tab G)

A total of **₱3,750,638,203.34** worth of damages in infrastructure and agriculture were reported in Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, CAR, and NCR

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS (Tab I)

The NDRRM OpCen was on **RED ALERT Status effective 8:00 AM, 19 September 2014** for a continuous monitoring and dissemination of Severe Weather Bulletins, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warnings, General Flood Advisories, and Dam Bulletin and Advisories to all Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (RDRRMCs) / OCD Regional Centers through Short Messaging System (SMS), facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels; and directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCDRCs to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibilities (AOR).

Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) meetings were conducted on 18 and 19 September 2014 at the NDRRM OpCen in anticipation for the effects of Tropical Storm "MARIO" (FUNG-WONG). The meetings were attended by the PDRA Core Group and led by the NDRRMC Executive Director USec Alexander P. Pama

IV. DISASTER RESPONSE (Tab J)

The Response Cluster was activated to monitor and act accordingly on identified/required needs and resources for response operations relative to the effects of Tropical Storm "Mario".

The Response Sub-cluster on Food and Non-Food Items (F/NFIs), Protection, Camp Coordination, and Management (PCCM), Health (WASH, Medical, Nutrition, and Psychosocial Services), Search, Rescue, and Retrieval (SRR), and Logistics were likewise activated.
