I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

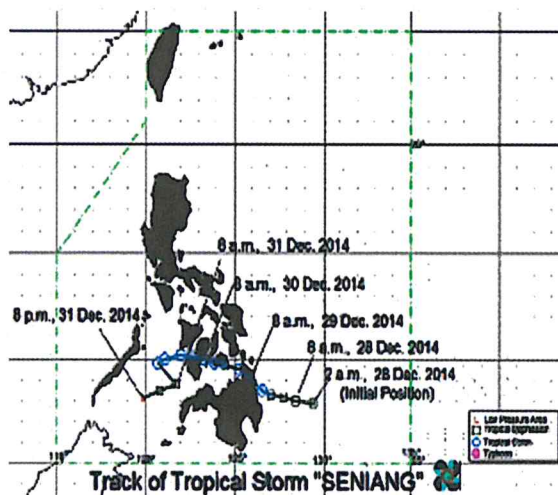
A. Chronology and Tracking

28 December 2014

- The Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has developed into a tropical depression and was named TD "SENIANG"

29 December 2014

- "SENIANG" has intensified into tropical storm (TS) and made landfall over Bakulin, Hinatuan, Surigao Del Surin early in the morning
- In the evening the same day, "SENIANG" has weakened into a tropical depression after its landfall over Anda, Bohol



30 December 2014

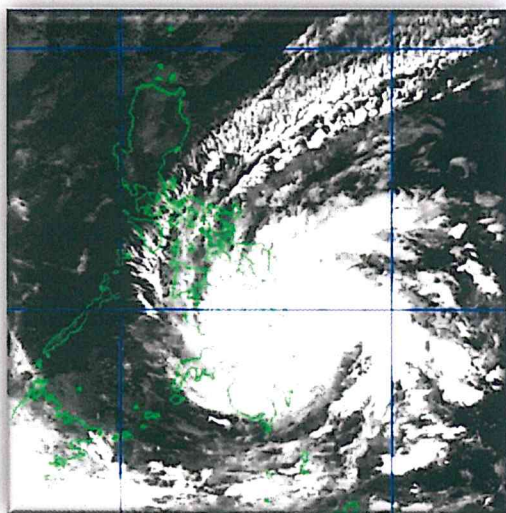
- "SENIANG" intensified again into a tropical storm and maintained its strength as it traversed over Cebu, Negros Oriental, and Panay Gulf. It accelerated as it moved towards Cuyo Island

31 December 2014

- "SENIANG" has weakened into a tropical depression and further into a LPA while over Sulu Sea.

B. Tropical Cyclone Analysis

Tropical Storm "SENIANG" was a LPA initially spotted over Caroline Island, Pacific Ocean. It entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on the 27th of December 2014 and intensified into a Tropical Depression early the following day.



It moved West Northwest towards Eastern Mindanao. It intensified into a Tropical Storm and was given an international name (JANGMI), a South Korean ancient female name "ROSE".

TS "SENIANG" made landfall over Hinatuan, Surigao Del Sur, then tracked across Southern Visayas and weakened into a TD. It became LPA in the evening of 31 December 2014. During the passage of **TS "SENIANG"**, significant amount of rainfall were recorded which caused flashfloods and landslides over the affected areas. The greatest amount of rainfall was recorded in Hinatuan, Surigao del

Sur on 28 December 2014 with 362.2 mm of rainfall recorded over 24 hours.

TS "SENIANG" stayed inside the PAR for four (4) days from 28-31 December 2014. It reached the maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph. During its stay in the PAR, Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) number 2 was the highest signal hoisted.

"SENIANG" was the 19th and the last tropical cyclone to enter the PAR in 2014, and the 7th tropical cyclone that made landfall/crossed the country after TS "BASYANG", TY "GLENDA", TY "LUIS", TS "MARIO", TS "QUEENIE", and TY "RUBY".

II. EFFECTS

B. Affected Population (Tab B)

- A total of **129,915 families / 602,627 persons** were affected in **1,094** barangays of **146** municipalities and **18** cities in **22** provinces Regions IV-B, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, and CARAGA
- Population served inside and outside evacuation centers: **118,886 families / 549,035 persons**:
 - Inside 984 evacuation centers: 92,644 families / 425,073 persons
 - Outside evacuation centers : 26,367 families / 124,455 persons

C. Casualties (Tab C)

- A total of **sixty-six (66) deaths, 43 persons were injured** and **six (6) are still missing** from Regions VI, VII, VIII, X, XI and CARAGA from Regions VII and CARAGA

D. Status of Lifelines

1. Roads and Bridges (Tab D)

- A total **twenty-seven (27) roads** and **twenty (20) bridges** in Regions V, VI, VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA are still not passable

2. Water Interruption

- A total of seven (7) barangays in Garcia, Hernandez in the Province of Bohol experienced water interruption

E. Damaged Houses (Tab E)

- A total of **3,523 houses** were damaged in Regions VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, and CARAGA: 654 totally and 2,869 partially
