#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

Typhoon “BUTCHOY” has Intensified further as it maintain its speed and direction. The estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within 600 km diameter of the typhoon.

<b>Location of Center: (as of 10:00 PM)</b>	1,190 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan
<b>Coordinates:</b>	17.3°N, 132.9°E
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum winds of 160 kph near the center and gustiness up to 195 kph
<b>Movement:</b>	Forecast to move Northwest at 30 kph
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	<i>Tomorrow evening:</i> <b>650 km East of Basco, Batanes</b> <i>Thursday evening :</i> <b>340 km North Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes</b> <i>Friday evening :</i> <b>530 km North of Itbayat, Batanes ( Outside PAR)</b> <i>Saturday evening :</i> <b>In the vicinity of Wenling, Taizhou</b> <i>Sunday evening :</i> <b>1,215 km North Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes ( Outside PAR)</b>

- The general public and disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are advised to monitor for the next update to be incorporated in the public weather forecast at 5:00 am tomorrow and for the next advisory to be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.

#### **II. ACTION/S TAKEN**

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 02 re Tropical Depression** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
  - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
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
