#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "BUTCHOY" continues to slow down as it approaches Taiwan.

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged</li> <li>Twigs of small trees may be broken</li> <li>Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.</li> </ul>

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 650 km diameter of the typhoon
- Fisherfolk are advised not to venture out over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the eastern seabord of Central and Southern Luzon.
- Southwest monsson is affecting Luzon and Western Visayas
- The general public and disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at 11:00PM today.

### II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 08 re
  Typhoon "BUTCHOY" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile
  and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their
  respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs)
  from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
