I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "BUTCHOY" has further weakened while crossing Southern Taiwan.

- Tropical Cyclone warning signals elsewhere are now lifted
- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 600 km diameter of the typhoon
- Fisherfolk are advised not to venture out over the southern and western seabords of Luzon
- "Butchoy" will enhance the Southwest monsoon which will bring moderate to occasionally heavy rains over the provinces of Zambales, Bataan, Batangas, Cavite, and Mindoro
- The general public and disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at 5:00 PM today.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 11 re Typhoon "BUTCHOY"** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
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
