#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "CARINA".

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Fisherfolk are alerted against moderate to rough seas over the eastern seaboardsof Luzon and Visayas.
- "Carina" will bring moderate to heavy rains over Bicol region, Eastern Visayas and CARAGA region which may trigger flashfloods and landslides

   and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to
   their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils
   (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
