I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "Carina" has maintained its strength and moves in a North Northwest direction.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Fisherfolk are alerted against moderate to rough seas over the eastern seaboard of Luzon and Visayas.
- Areas under TCWS #1, the rest of Visayas and the provinces of Albay, Sorsogon and Masbate are alerted against moderate to heavy rains which may trigger flashfloods and landslides.
- Southwest Monsson enhanced by TD Carina will bring moderate to occasionally heavy rains over MIMAROPA.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 08 re
 Tropical Depression "CARINA" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS
 and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to
 their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils
 (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
