I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon with International Name "LIONROCK" has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "DINDO"

Location of Center : (as of 12:00 p.m.)	1,200 km East Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes
Coordinates:	24.9°N, 132.5°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 130 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 160 kph.
Movement:	Forecast to move South Southwest at 7 kph.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 01 re Typhoon "DINDO" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
