#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TYPHOON "FERDIE" HAS EXITED THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 600 km diameter of the Typhoon.
- The Typhoon has exited the PAR at 12:30 PM today.
- Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal elsewhere are now lowered

## II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 18 re
  Typhoon "FERDIE" (I.N. MERANTI) to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and
  facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their
  respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from
  the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
