I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"JULIAN" has passed between Batanes-Babuyan Group of Islands area early morning today and continues to move towards the western boundary of PAR.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Storm
- Tropical Storm "JULIAN" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) this afternoon
- Small sea crafts are advised not to venture out over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon

Location of Center: (as of 7:00 AM)	125 km West of Basco, Batanes (20.5°N, 120.8°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 85 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 130 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move West at 25 kph
Forecast Positions / Outlook:	24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 530 km West of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) 48 Hour (Saturday morning): 750 km West of Calayan, Cagayan (OUTSIDE PAR) 72 Hour (Sunday morning): 890 km West of Calayan, Cagayan (OUTSIDE PAR)

2 (61-120 kph Expected in 24 hours)	Batanes and Babuyan Group of Islands			• Light to moderate damage to high risk structures • Very light to light damage to medium-risk structures • No damage to very light damage to low risk structures • Unshielded, old dilapidated schoolhouses, makeshift shanties, and other structures of light materials are partially damaged or unroofed • A number of nipa and cogon houses may be partially or totally unroofed. • Some old galvanized iron (G. I.) roofs may be peeled or blown off • Some wooden, old electric posts are tilted or downed • Some damage to poorly constructed signs/billboards • In general, the winds may bring light to moderate damage to the exposed communities. Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken • Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken • Rice and corn may be adversely affected • Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down
Wave height:(Open Sea) 4.1-14.0 meters Storm surge possible at coastal areas

1 (30-60kph Expected in 36 hours)	Rest of Northern Cagayan, Apayao and Ilocos Norte			• Very light or no damage to low risk structures • Light damage to medium to high risk structures • Slight damage to some houses of very light materials or makeshift structures in exposed communities. Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged • Twigs of small trees may be broken • Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage
Wave height:(Open Sea) 1.25-4.0 meters

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 10 re Tropical Storm "JULIAN"** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
