Severe Weather Bulletin No. 11 re Tropical Storm "JULIAN"

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"JULIAN" has continued to move westward as it approaches the western boundary of PAR.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Storm
- Tropical Storm "JULIAN" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) this afternoon
- Small sea crafts are advised not to venture out over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon
- **Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal elsewhere are now lifted**

Location of Center: (as of 10:00 AM)	210 km West of Basco, Batanes (20.5°N, 120.0°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 75 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 115 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move West at 25 kph
Forecast Positions / Outlook:	24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 520 km West of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) 48 Hour (Saturday morning): 750 km West of Calayan, Cagayan (OUTSIDE PAR) 72 Hour (Sunday morning): 890 km West of Calayan, Cagayan (OUTSIDE PAR)

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 11** re **Tropical Storm "JULIAN"** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
