

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Luzon has developed into Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "JULIAN".

<ul style="list-style-type: none">Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.	
Location of Center: (as of 4:00AM)	720 km East of Calayan, Cagayan (19.0°N,128.3°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 45 kph and gustiness of up to 55 kph near the center
Movement:	Forecast to move West Northwest at 25 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	24 Hour(Tomorrow morning): 115 KM East Southeast of Basco, Batanes
	48 Hour (Friday morning): 355 km Northwest of Laoag City, Ilocos Norte (OUTSIDE PAR)
	72 Hour (Saturday morning): 650 km Northwest of Laoag City, Ilocos Norte (OUTSIDE PAR)

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 01 re Tropical Depression "JULIAN"** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
