I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "JULIAN" continues to move in a westward direction as it intensified slightly.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression
- Tropical Depression Julian is expected to pass close over Batanes-Babuyan area tomorrow morning
- Small sea crafts are advised not to venture out in the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon

Location of Center: (as of 4:00 PM)	305 km East Southeast of Basco, Batanes (19.5°N,124.7°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 70 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move west at 25 kph
Forecast Positions / Outlook:	24 Hour(Tomorrow afternoon): 180km West of Basco, Batanes 48 Hour (Friday afternoon): 520 km West of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) 72 Hour (Saturday afternoon): 655 km West Northwest of Laoag City, Ilocos Norte (OUTSIDE PAR)

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 05 re Tropical Depression "JULIAN"** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
