# NDRRMC UPDATE

#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Typhoon "KAREN" is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within 500 km diameter of the typhoon.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the Northern and Western seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon.
- Meanwhile at 2:00 AM today, the Typhoon with international name "HAIMA" was located at 1,430 km East of Visayas (12.2°N, 137.8°E). It is expected to enter the eastern boundary of the PAR this afternoon (17 October 2016).

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

 NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 23-FINAL for Typhoon "KAREN" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.  Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
