### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

"LAWIN" has maintained its strength as it continues to move in a west northwest direction.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 600 km diameter of the Typhoon
- Expected to intensify further before making a landfall
- Expected to make landfall over Cagayan Area by Thursday morning, 20
   October 2016, then cross llocos Norte and Apayao
- Possible exit PAR on Friday 21 October 2016

Location of Eye/Center	At 10:00PM today, the eye of Typhoon "LAWIN" was located based on all available data at 1,070 km of East of Virac, Catanduanes (13.9°N, 134.1°E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 175 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 215 kph
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West Northwest at 22 kph

### II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 02 for Typhoon "LAWIN" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
