I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

"MARCE" continues to move in a west northwest direction and is now traversing Visayan sea.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the tropical depression.
- Residents of areas under TCWS No. 1 and the rest of Bicol region are advised to be alert against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboards of Northern Luzon
- Expected to exit the PAR by Sunday evening (27 November 2016) or Monday early morning (28 November 2016)

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 12 for Tropical Depression "MARCE" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
