I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

“MARCE” has maintained its strength as it continues to move west towards Mindanao.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 200 km diameter of the Tropical Depression
- Residents of areas under TCWS No. 1 are advised to be alert against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Sea travel is risky over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon
- Expected to make landfall over Surigao provinces tomorrow afternoon or early evening
- Expected to exit PAR on Monday morning (28 November 2016)

Location of Eye/Center	At 4:00AM today, the center of Tropical Depression “MARCE” was estimated based on all available data at 240 km of East Northeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (9.0°N, 128.4°E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 55 kph
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West Northwest at 17 kph

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 05 for Tropical Depression “MARCE”** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
