Severe Weather Bulletin No. 10 re Tropical Depression "AURING"

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Tropical Depression "AURING" has weakened slightly after it made landfall over Siargao Island.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Residents of areas with TCWS No. 1 and over the rest of Eastern and Central Visayas are alerted against possible flash floods and landslides.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Visayas and of Mindanao.
- Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals elsewhere are now lifted.

Location of Eye/Center	At 7:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "AURING" was estimated based on all available data at 35 km West Northwest of Surigao City Surigao del Norte (9.9°N, 125.2°E) .
Strength	Maximum winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 75 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West Northwest at 9 kph

ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 10 for Tropical Depression “AURING”** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
