## I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Tropical Depression "AURING" has maintained its course as it moves closer to Bohol.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Residents of areas with TCWS No. 1 and over the rest of Eastern and Central Visayas are alerted against possible flash floods and landslides.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Visayas and of Mindanao.

Location of Eye/Center		At 1:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "AURING" was estimated based on all available data at 30 km South Southeast of Maasin City, Southern Leyte (09.9°N, 124.9°E).

## **ACTIONS TAKEN**

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 12 for Tropical Depression "AURING" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
