I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Mindanao has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "AURING".

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression (TD).
- Resident of areas with TCWS No. 1 are alerted against possible flash floods and landslides.
- Expected to make landfall over Surigao Provinces between Sunday evening until Monday early morning.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Mindanao.

At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "AURING" was estimated based on all available data at 260 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (7.8°N, 128.6 °E).

ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 1 for Tropical Depression "AURING" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
