AVERAGE BASIN RAINFALL AS OF 8:00 PM TODAY:

Past 12-hrs rainfall = Light Forecast 24-hr rainfall = Light

As of 7:00 pm today, the center of Typhoon Ompong was located based on all available data at 240 km West Northwest of Laog City, Ilocos Norte. (19.2 n,118.6 e) with maximum sustained winds of up to 160 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 195 km/h. It is forecast to move north northwest at 25 kph/h. Ompong is expected to exit the Philippine Area of responsibility tonight.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED

Rivers and Tributaries in:

- Bicol River and streams particularly Sipocot tributary river
- Streams and river tributary of the low-lying areas of the Municipalities of Libon, Polangui, Oas, Ligao, Bato, Nabua, Baao, Bula, Buhi, Iriga City, Pili, Camaligan, Bombon, Magarao, Canaman, Naga City, Gainza, Milaor, Minalabac, Pamplona, San Fernando, Calabanga, Cabusao, Libmanan, Sipocot and Lupi

With this development, and unless significant rains occurs, this is the final General flood advisory for this event. People living near the mountain slopes and low-lying areas near the above mentioned rivers and streams are adviced to be alert for possible flashfloods and landslides, and the local disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are adviced to be alert and take appropriate actions.
