PRESENT WEATHER:

AT 3:00 PM TODAY 29 JULY 2020, THE LOW PRESSURE AREA (LPA) WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 35 KM NORTH NORTHWEST OF DAET, CAMARINES NORTE (14.4 °N, 122.8 °E). SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING SOUTHERN LUZON, VISAYAS, AND MINDANAO.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LEYTE - particularly Sangputan, Palo, Solano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadac-an, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagbangan, Pagsangahan, and Binahaan. • NORTHERN SAMAR - particularly Catarman, Bugko, Pambujan, Catubig, Palapag, Mawo, and Gamay. • EASTERN SAMAR - particularly Oras, Dolores, Ulot, Taft, Borongan, Suribao, Llorente, Balangiga, and Sulat. • SOUTHERN LEYTE - particularly Bisay, Himbangan, and Pandan. • SAMAR - particularly Basey, Silanga, Calbiga, and Jibatan. • BILIRAN

People living near the mountains slopes and in the low-lying areas of the above-mentioned river systems and the **LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCILS** concerned are *still* advised to take necessary precautionary measures and *to be alert for possible flashfloods*.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
