PRESENT WEATHER:

Southwest Monsoon affecting the western section of Northern Luzon.

No. 02 for Region I (Ilocos Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ILOCOS SUR particularly Lower Abra, Silay-Sta. Maria, and Buaya. ILOCOS NORTE particularly Bulu, Banban, Bacarra-Vintar, Laoag and Quiaoit. La Union particularly Amburayan, Bararo, Lower Bauang and Aringay.

No. 03 (FINAL) for Region IX (Zamboanga Peninsula)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light rains
WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY particularly Tumaga, Taguite, Tigbao, Digma, Sanito, Bakalan, Kabasalan and Sibuguey. ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR particularly Kamalarang, Tupilac, Labangan and Mapangi. ZAMBOANGA DEL NORTE particularly Paro-Dapitan, Dipolog, Dikaya, Golid Duwait, Sindangan, Ingin (Maras), Palandoc, Bucas, Pataug, Quipit, Siocon, Piacan, Anungan, Pangamiran and Sibuco.
With this development and unless significant rain occurs, this is the final General Flood Advisory for this event.	

No. 02 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> APAYAO particularly Upper Abulug. BENGUET particularly Upper Bauang. ABRA particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin.


People living near the mountains slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils concerned are advised to take necessary precautionary measures.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
