PRESENT WEATHER:

AT 3:00 PM TODAY, TROPICAL DEPRESSION “LUIS” WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 350 KM NORTH NORTHWEST OF BASCO, BATANES (23.5 °N, 121.1 °E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 55 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 90 KM/H. IT IS MOVING EAST NORTHEAST AT 15 KM/H. SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING THE WESTERN SECTIONS OF NORTHERN AND CENTRAL LUZON.
