At 3:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 415 KM East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.5N, 129.5E). Southwest Monsoon affecting Extreme Northern Luzon. Typhoon JEBI at 3:00 AM Location: 2,500 KM East of Northern Luzon (17.8N, 145.3E) (Outside Par), Maximum Sustained Winds: 180 KM/H, Gustiness: Up to 220 KM/H, Movement: West at 20 KM/H.

Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
