FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains and thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: LA UNION particularly Amburayan, Bararo, Lower Bauang and Aringay. ILOCOS NORTE particularly Bulu, Banban, Bacarra-Vintar, Laoag and Quiaoit PANGASINAN particularly Balincuguin and Alaminos. ILOCOS SUR particularly Lower Abra, Silay-Sta. Maria and Buaya.

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: BATAAN particularly Balanga and Moron. ZAMBALES particularly Panatawan, Sto. Tomas, Bucau, Bancul and Lawis.

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains and thunderstorms	
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: APAYAO particularly Upper Abulug. BENGUET particularly Upper Bauang. IFUGAO KALINGA MOUNTAIN PROVINCE ABRA particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin.
