At 3:00 AM today, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 350 KM East of Casiguran, Aurora (16.2°N, 125.4°E).

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BENGUET particularly Upper Bauang. • ABRA particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin. • APAYAO particularly Upper Abulug
