### PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "MARING" was estimated based on all available data at 150 km East of Infanta, Quezon (14.8°N, 123.0°E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. It is forecast to move West Northwest at 11 km/h. Meanwhile, at 3:00 am today, the eye of Typhoon "LANNIE" was located based on all available data at 1,145 km East of Aparri, Cagayan (19.7°N, 132.4°E) with maximum sustained winds of 120 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 145 km/h. It is forecast to move West Northwest at 26 km/h.
