Laguna – particularly Pagsanjan, Pila-Sta.Cruz, San Juan, and San Cristobal. Cavite – particularly Laboc (Balsahan), Cañas, Ilang-ilang, and Imus Rizal – particularly Upper Marikina and Kaliwa

No. 25 for Region IV-B (MIMAROPA)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	LIGHT TO OCCASIONALLY MODERATE RAINS
	Rivers and Tributaries in:
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Occidental Mindoro – particularly Abra de Ilog, Cagaray, Labangan, Magbando, Lunintao, Anahawin, Monpong, Amnay, Pola, Pagbahan, Mamburao, and Ibod. Oriental Mindoro – particularly Malaylay-Baco, Pulang Tubig, Mag-asawang Tubig, Butas, Pula, Agsalin, Bansud, Samagui, Bongabon, Baroc, Bulalacao, and Balete.
