PRESENT WEATHER:

Tail-end of cold front affecting eastern section of Southern Luzon. Northeast monsoon affecting Northern Luzon and Central Luzon.

WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Zamboanga Sibugay – particularly Tumaga, Taguite, Tigbao, Digma, Sanito, Bakalan, Kabasalan and Sibuguey• Zamboanga del Sur – particularly Kamalarang, Tupilac, Labangan and Mapangi• Zamboanga del Norte – particularly Paro-Dapitan, Dipolog, Dikaya, Golid Duwait, Sindangan, Ingin (Maras), Palandoc, Bucas, Pataug, Quipit, Siocon, Piacan, Anungan, Pangamiran and Sibuco
