PRESENT WEATHER:

At 03:00 PM today, two Low Pressure Areas (LPA) embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) were estimated based on all available data at 640 East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (9.7°N, 131.3°E) and at 405 East of Infanta, Quezon (15.0°N, 125.4°E) and at 405 East of Infanta, Quezon (15.0°N, 125.4°E).

Aklan particularly Ibajay, Aklan and Jalo. Guimaras rivers and its tributaries. Iloilo particularly Pinantan, Barotac, Akalaygan, Jalaud, Jalano, Jagdong, Lamunan, Jaro-Agaman, Sibalom and Guimbal.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: Camiguin rivers and its tributaries. Bukidnon particularly Upper Tagaloan, Upper/Eastern Cagayan. Lanao del Norte particularly Mandulog, Agus, Liangan and Maranding. Misamis Occidental particularly Clarin, Palilan and Aloran. Misamis Oriental particularly Odiongan, Gingoog, Balatocan, Cabulig, Lower Tagaloan, Lower/Middle Western Cagayan, Iponon and Alubijid.

No. 10 for Region XI (Davao Region)

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: Davao Occidental particularly Panglan, Malita, Batanan (Lais, Lawan, Latuan, Calian, Lamita, Lawayon, Culama, Caburan Bi, Maubio, Karabana, Tubayo, Kayapung,Malala, Capisolo, Tanoman Bi, Tanoman Smal, Kalbay, Butua, Nuin, Butula, Baki, Malagupo, Balagona, Batulaki. Davao del Sur particularly Davao, Talomo, Lipadas, Tagulaya Sibulan, Digos and Padada Mainit. Davao Oriental particularly Cateel, Dapnan, Baganga Mahan-ub, Manorigao, Caraga, Casauman, Quinonoan, Bagwan, Mayo, Bitanayan, Sumlog, Tangmoan, Dacongbonwa, Kabasagan, Manay, Maya and Sumlao/Cuabo

Sarangani particularly Kalaong, Buayan-Malungan, Little-Lun, Big-Lun and Gian. South Cotabato particularly Siquil, Makar and Banaga. Sultan Kudarat particularly Tian and Kraan.

No. 10 for Region XIII (CARAGA)

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: Surigao del Norte particularly Surigao and Magallanes. Surigao del Sur particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig.

- Dinagat Islands particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet.
- Agusan Del Norte particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran.
- Agusan Del Sur particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan.
