At 3:00 pm today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 115°km North of Aparri, Cagayan (19.4°N, 121.6°E). Meanwhile another LPA was estimated based on all available data at 765°km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (6.9°N, 133.1°E). Southwest Monsoon affecting the western section of Luzon.

### No. 10 for Region III (Central Luzon)

Tomas, Bucau, Bancul and Lawis.</li><li>• <b>Bulacan</b> – All rivers and its tributaries.</li><li>• <b>Tarlac</b> – All rivers and its tributaries.</li><li>• <b>Aurora</b> – Rivers and its tributaries particularly Casiguran, Agung, and Lower Umiray.</li><li>• <b>Nueva Ecija</b> – All rivers and its tributaries.</li></ul>

### No. 03 for Region XI (Davao Region)

<b>FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL</b>	Light to moderate rains with thunderstorms
<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<b>Rivers and Tributaries in:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Davao del Sur</b> - particularly Davao, Talomo, Lipadas, Tagulaya Sibulan, Digos, and Padada Mainit.</li><li>• <b>Davao del Norte</b> - particularly Tagum-Libuganon, Tuganay, Saug, and Lasang.</li><li>• <b>Compostela Valley</b> – particularly Matibo and Hijo.</li></ul>

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low-lying areas of the above-mentioned river systems and the LDRRMCs concerned **still take necessary precautionary measures and are advised to be alert for possible flashfloods.**

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio

stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
